The Story – Reconciliation

Sin separates us from God.

God is writing His story in you, for the sake of the world, and for the glory of His great name.

For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him (in Jesus), 20 and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross. 21 Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behavior. 22 But now he has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in his sight,
